HOCHTIEF subsidiary wins new contracts for almost half a billion euros

Turner joint venture to build new Police Academy in New York - New campus building in Atlanta

The HOCHTIEF subsidiary Turner has been awarded large new contracts in the US education segment: Together with a partner, the company will provide construction management for New York's new Police Academy for approximately EUR 452 million (USD 656 million). Turner's share in the project is 50 percent (approximately EUR 226 million). In addition, Turner, the US market leader for building educational facilities, will construct a new teaching facility on the campus of the Georgia Institute of Technology in Atlanta. The contract has a volume of approximately EUR 43 million (USD 63 million).

The new Police Academy in Queens, New York, will have a capacity to train up to 2,000 recruits of the New York City Police Department (NYPD). In addition to teaching facilities and a physical training building, the 140,000-square-meter Academy site will also feature a utility building. The first project phase will be completed by 2013. The project is targeting a LEED Silver certification from the United States Green Building Council. In Atlanta, Turner will manage construction of the 20,000-square-meter G. Wayne Clough Undergraduate Learning Commons. The facility will include science laboratories, classrooms, lecture halls and project team rooms. The project is scheduled for completion in May 2011.
